

Alumni Spotlight



Alumnus Dave Faehner (1960) has spent 57 years serving the SDA education system. On October 29, 2022, Dave, at the age of 80, retired. For the past 37 of his 57 years of serving, Dave has been at Andrews University in Berrien Springs, Michigan. Of his position as the Vice President of University Advancement, Dave states, "the focus was on enrollment of students, alumni, public relations and fundraising, yet deep in my soul, students were always foremost in my mind – to make it a better place/school for the students! The bottom line is the thrill of helping young people reach the highest level of their accomplishments. This makes me proud of their successes!!"

Dave credits his academic "start" to the nine months spent at Blue Mountain Academy. Arriving in the fall of 1959, Dave attended BMA as a senior and graduated on May 28, 1960, a mere nine months on campus. During that time, Dave made many fine friends and appreciated the staff and the school as a whole. His grades improved and his interest in education perked, thanks to two faculty members – Bible teacher, Elder Shorter, and dean and history teacher, Dean Kinsey – who made a special impact on his life. At that time Dave was not completely aware of the effect they were making and how it would influence his future. Commending his Bible teacher as a first-class gentleman in all his dealings, and for presenting "his class material as Psychology 101 with a strong Christian twist," Dave always remembered Elder Shorter talking about the "'big three'. 'One, develop a strong relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. Two, search for a spouse who has a strong tie to the Lord; and three, find an occupation that allows you to share your faith.'"

The second person who made a strong impression, Dean Kinsey, showed high moral character and was an excellent dean and history teacher. Although Dave did not work for the dean or hang around the dean's office, Dave's observation of Dean Kinsey started Dave's thought process for that type of occupation. Upon graduating from BMA, Dave attended <u>A</u>tlantic <u>U</u>nion <u>C</u>ollege (AUC) and this time he became a friend of the dean, who years later asked Dave to become his assistant dean of men. Dave transferred to <u>C</u>olumbia <u>U</u>nion <u>C</u>ollege (CUC)

graduating as a history major in 1965. Dave hoped to receive a call to be a dean and a history or PE teacher,

however, he did not receive a call, and drove a bread truck for the summer before receiving a call to become a teacher/principal at the Harrisburg church school. He then transferred to Spencerville Junior Academy as a Social Studies and Math teacher. Dave received a call to be a boys' dean at Broadview Academy in Illinois, followed by 13 years in Student Life at Loma Linda University, and then in 1985 arrived at Andrews University as the Vice President for University Advancement, along with his wife, Frances, who was offered the position of Dean of Women. Dave was already familiar with Andrews, receiving his Master's from Andrews in 1972. He also has a PhD in Student Personnel Administration with an emphasis on psychology received in 1980 from the University of Northern Colorado.

Although it is with mixed emotions, Dave is looking forward to retirement with plans of traveling in Europe with his younger brother, Mark; learning pickleball; maybe working on some special projects for the University; and possibly tracking down and reconnecting with the 118 boys he had at Broadview Academy when their dean – "a special group, yet the hardest job in my career!"

Another of his retirement plans includes writing a book. As a youngster Dave states he "had the privilege of growing up in Howard Beach, Queens, NYC" attending PS.146 in Queens during his elementary years. From "a large clan of family members," the Faehner family grew up in the same town, attended the same church, and twenty-five of his relatives graduated from PS. 146. He attended the local high school for a bit, and two years at Greater New York Academy prior to attending BMA. Dave states that although not a writer, he has a strong interest in history and storytelling. He would like to write of the Faehner clan's sawdust business, the largest in the United States, which his Grandfather started in 1919. 1919 is also the year his Grandmother became a Seventh-Day Adventist, which has had a powerful influence on the generations that followed.

Just as Dave is enthusiastic of his role as Vice President of University Advancement, he is more excited about his service to students. While seeing the endowment fund grow from three million to over 80 million during the past 37 years is pleasing, Dave and his wife, Frances, gain more joy in welcoming over 10,000 students into their home throughout the years; and watching the students they serve reach their potential. Their passion and leadership for Adventist education and focus on educating students is undeniable and rewarding. Dave continues his interests in serving the University and the students by leading alumni meetings worldwide.
