Students will not be registered unless the online form is submitted and both counselor and parent sign offs are completed by the due date. Register by 10/6/23.

All dual enrollment students who take a course in fall and/or spring of the 2023-24 school year are eligible for the Dual Enrollment Student Summer Scholarship Opportunity!
