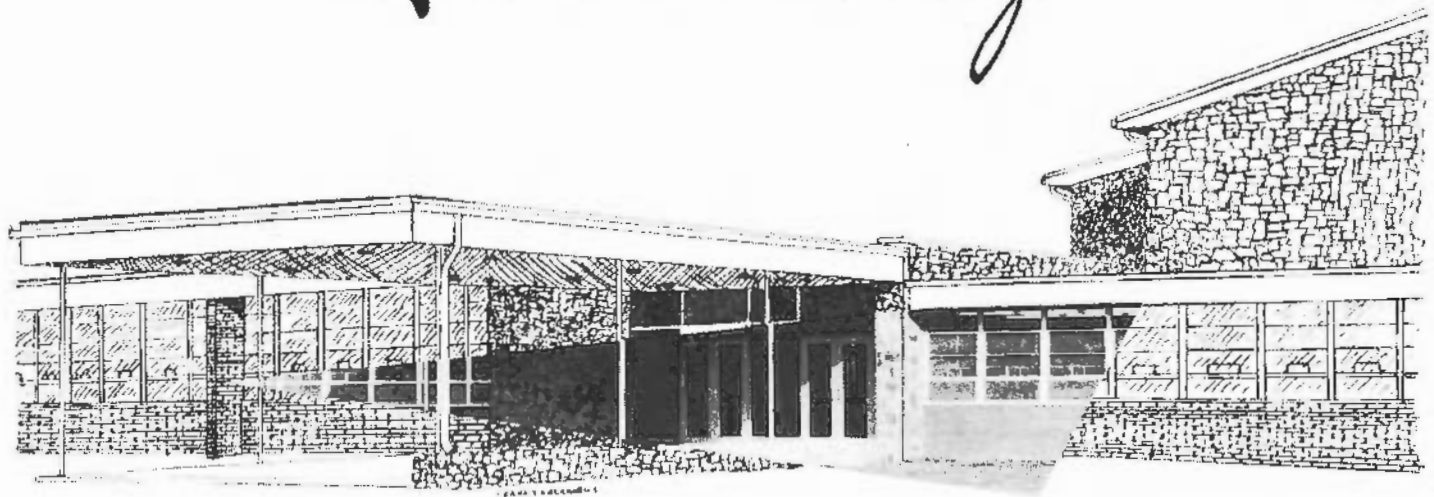

The Weikums joined our school family last year. Mr. Weikum manages Harris Pine Mill. Their new home, on the highest point of our school farm, overlooks the campus.

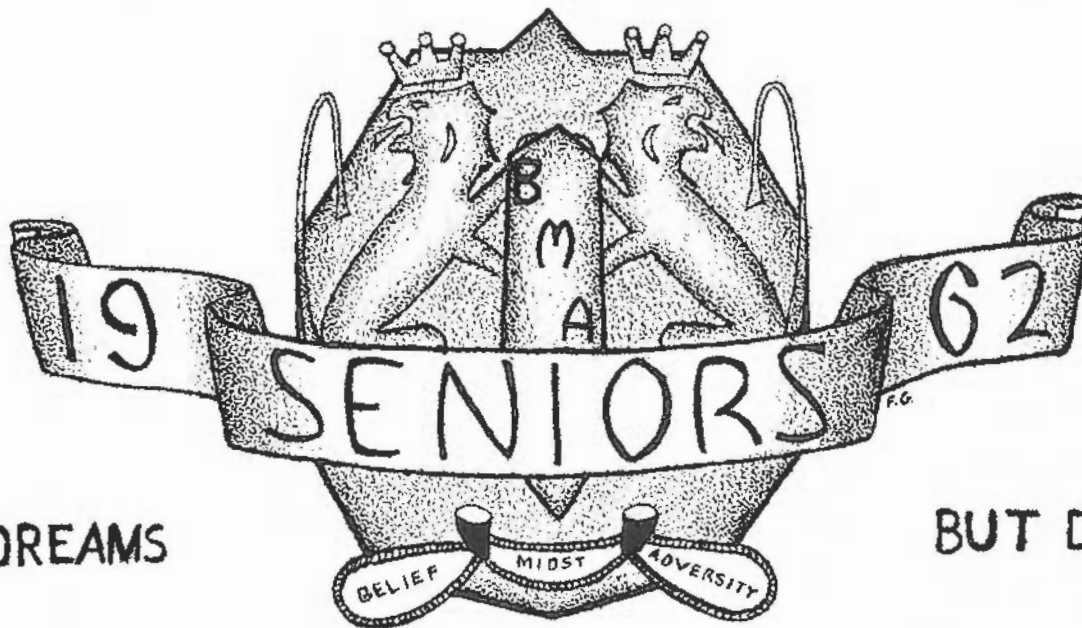
THE WALLACES
