LOOK AT IT THIS WAY:

Movies by Max Phillips

What's wrong with movies? The question, at least, is pertinent. Laying aside all judgments based on feeling, just what is wrong with the movies?

It cannot be said that movies are wrong because they represent a certain type or medium of communication any more than it can be said that books are wrong because they represent a certain type of communication. To say that all movies are bad because some movies are bad is like saying that all books are bad because some books are bad. There are good movies just as there are good and bad books.
