Shortly afterwards, assembled in the gym, was the new school family. Old friends reunited and new acquaintances were made.


After shaking approximately 400 hands, with one plastered smile, the night ended. It looked like it was going to be a great year.

The games ended and class points were tallied up. Everyone then proceeded to the gym to see the movie, "Follow Me Boys", afterwhich the winning class was announced.






AMATEUR HOUR



HAIL TO THE CHIEF

One of the unique principles that our country is built upon is the fact that we have the freedom to elect the leader of our country. This is done once every four years, and 1980 was the year for our country to elect a new leader. On November II, 1980, the people of our nation went to the polls and elected a new President. Three main candidates were running for the "top job." Jimmy Carter, incumbent - a Democrat, John Anderson - an Independent, and Ronald Reagan, ex-governor of California - a Republican. After all the polls had closed, the votes counted, and the information fed into computers, America had a new President. Mr. Reagan won the Presidency with a landslide victory by taking 44 states.

At the age of 70, Mr. Reagan is the oldest person to ever become President. The new First Lady, Nancy Reagan, is the President's second wife. The Reagans have four children and two grandchildren. The Reagan's enjoy horseback riding and relaxing at their ranch in California.

On January 20, 1981, Ronald W. Reagan became our 40th President. The day began with a special church service for the Reagans. Then they went to the White House to meet the Carters and prepare for the Inauguration. After the swearing-in, they watched the parade and traveled to their new home in the White House. The day ended with a short visit to each of 8 Inaugural Balls.

Shortly after becoming President, Mr. Reagan began putting campaign promises to work by freezing the hiring of any more government workers. This is part of his plan to cut down on federal spending.

We as a nation have four years ahead of us with a new President. May we always as a country, church, school, and people, look to God for help, guidance, strength, and protection throughout the next four years. The Lord bless you President Reagan.

COMING HOME

On November 4, 1979, the world was taken by surprise by the seizure of the U. S. Embassy in Tehran, Iran. by a group of students. At first it was unclear as to what their purpose was, but it soon became clear that their main goal was to undermine Prime Minister Barazagan. After Barzagan resigned, the students reasons for keeping the 66 captives also changed. They said that if the U. S. would return the Shah, who was in New York for medical treatment, and his money, they would release the 66 men and women. The United States refused.

On November 19 and 20, the Iranian students released 8 men and 5 women. That brought the number of hostages down to 53. In July of 1980, they released Richard Queen because of illness. The students announced that the rest of the hostages would be tried as spies.

The hostages first Christmas in captivity came and America responded with an outpouring of cards, gifts, and encouragement. The Ayatollah Khomeini, Iran's religious leader, allowed the U. S. to send 4 clergymen, 2 Catholic priests and 2 Protestant ministers.

Four months after the takeover, April 4, 1980, President Carter ordered a raid on the embassy to free the hostages. 3 of the 8 helicopters failed and the raid was cancelled. As the ISO man team was leaving the desert refueling stop to return to the aircraft carriers, one of the helicoptors crashed with a C-I3O transport plane. Eight men lost their lives. Their bodies and the planes were abandoned in the Iranian desert. The students quickly dispersed the hostages to different parts of the country to discourage any further rescue attempts.

Negotiations resumed and once again families hopes were raised and then dashed to pieces. Their first year in captivity came to a close. Information about the hostages slowly stopped. The second Thanksgiving and Christmas without them at home passed. Again Americans sent cards, gifts, and more encouragement to the hostages and their families. Iran sent films showing some but not all of the hostages.

As the close of President Carter's term approached, negotiations were intensified. Iran asked Algiers to act as intermediary for the two nations. All three countries worked to free the hostages so that Iran wouldn't have to deal with a new U. S. president.

On January I9, the final agreements were made. There was a possibility that President Carter's wish to make the announcement that the hostages were free might be realized. The Iranians stalled and ex- President Carter learned that the Americans had left Iranian air space while he was in flight to Plains, Georgia after the Inauguration.


The hostages were flown to Algiers and officially handed over to the United States. They were then flown to the U. S. Air Force base in Wiesbaden, West Germany. They stayed at the base for 5 days and were examined by doctors, dentists, psychologists, and other medical and military personnel.

On January 25, 1981 the ex-hostages were flown from West Germany to West Point Military Academy in New York. They were met there by close family members. Two days later they left for Washington, D. C. to be officially welcomed by President Reagan. They were met at Andrews Air Force base by more family members. Hostages and families rode in buses through the capital to the White House. The route was lined by thousands of exuberant, flag- waving Americans. After the reception and welcome at the White House, the hostages were allowed to return to their homes. Many were received by additional parades and heroes welcomes in their hometowns.

The ex-hostages and their families have days of adjustment ahead of them, and will still need the nations prayers and encouragement.

Welcome back fellow Americans!
