












Reflections on Antigua

It was this privilege of building a new S.D.A. school for the people of Antigua that Blue Mountain Academy participated in. Antigua is 108 square miles and is located in the heart of the Caribbean.

The island had ideal climate temperatures averaging between 76°F and 83°. Rainfall is 45 inches per year with the average humidity of 79%. Antigua has a population of over 70,000 people-quite a bit smaller that Philadelphia.

Of course, there is so much to say about Antigua, but as I reflect back onto the 2 weeks that we were in Antigua, all the hard work, much experience with less facilities, different foods, and getting to know many warm and friendly people, we were very sad to leave. As we said good-bye, tears came to all of our eyes, but we will always have addresses and a love for Jesus that someday soon we can meet again-if not on this earth-in the new earth to come


#### OPEN HOUSE


















# BANQUET




















## SENIOR RECOGNITION
