The things we have long left behind us.

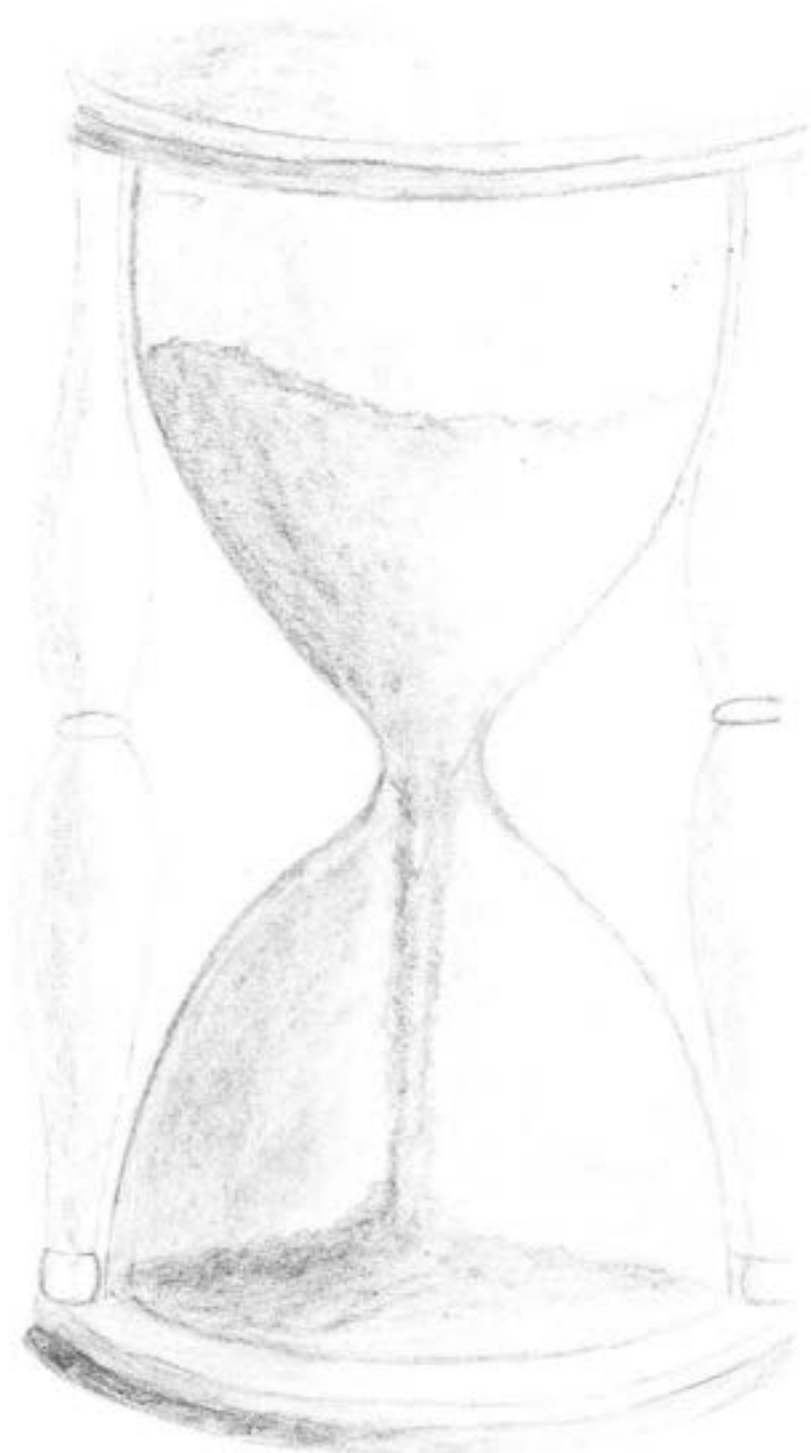
The last day our friends will wipe our weeping eyes,

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE



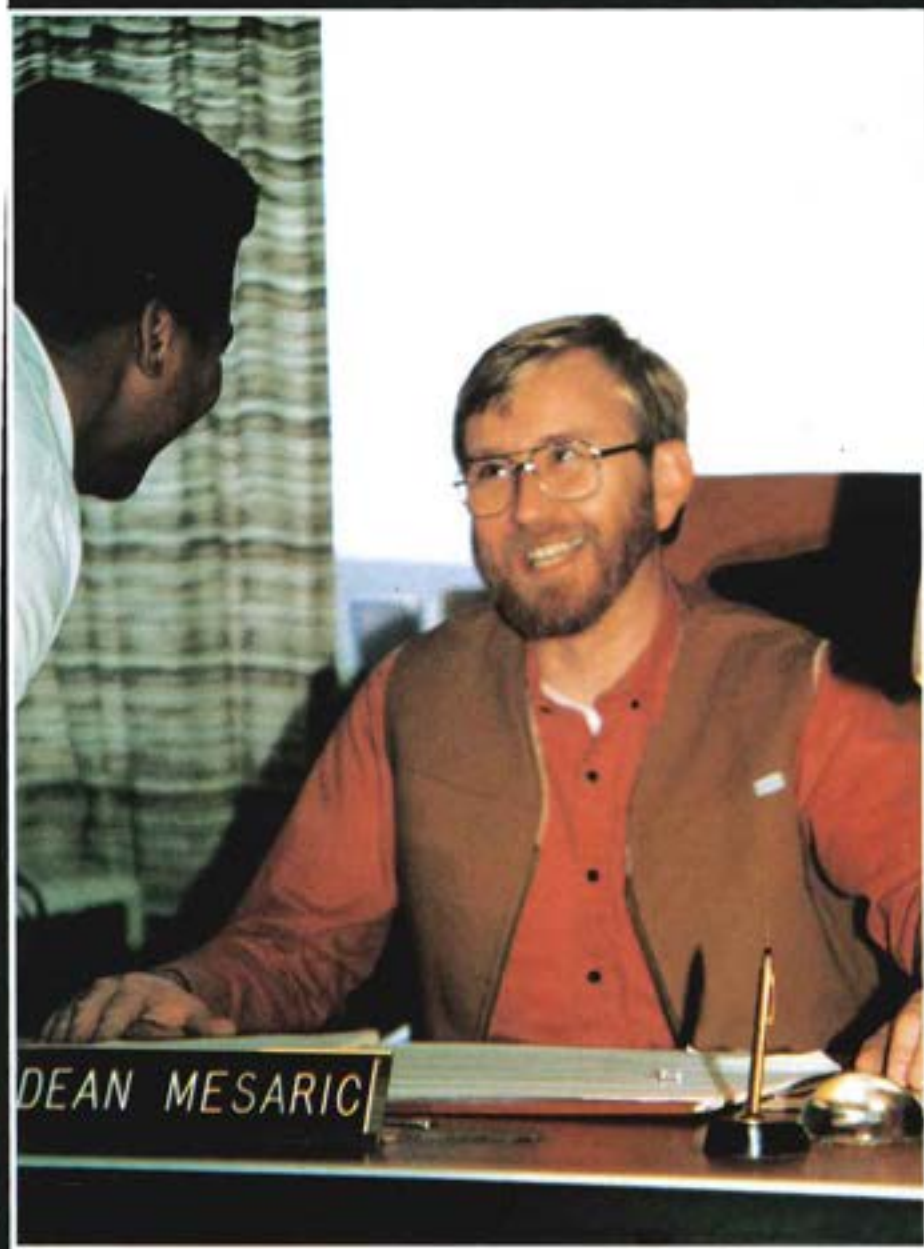

When all the chores are through

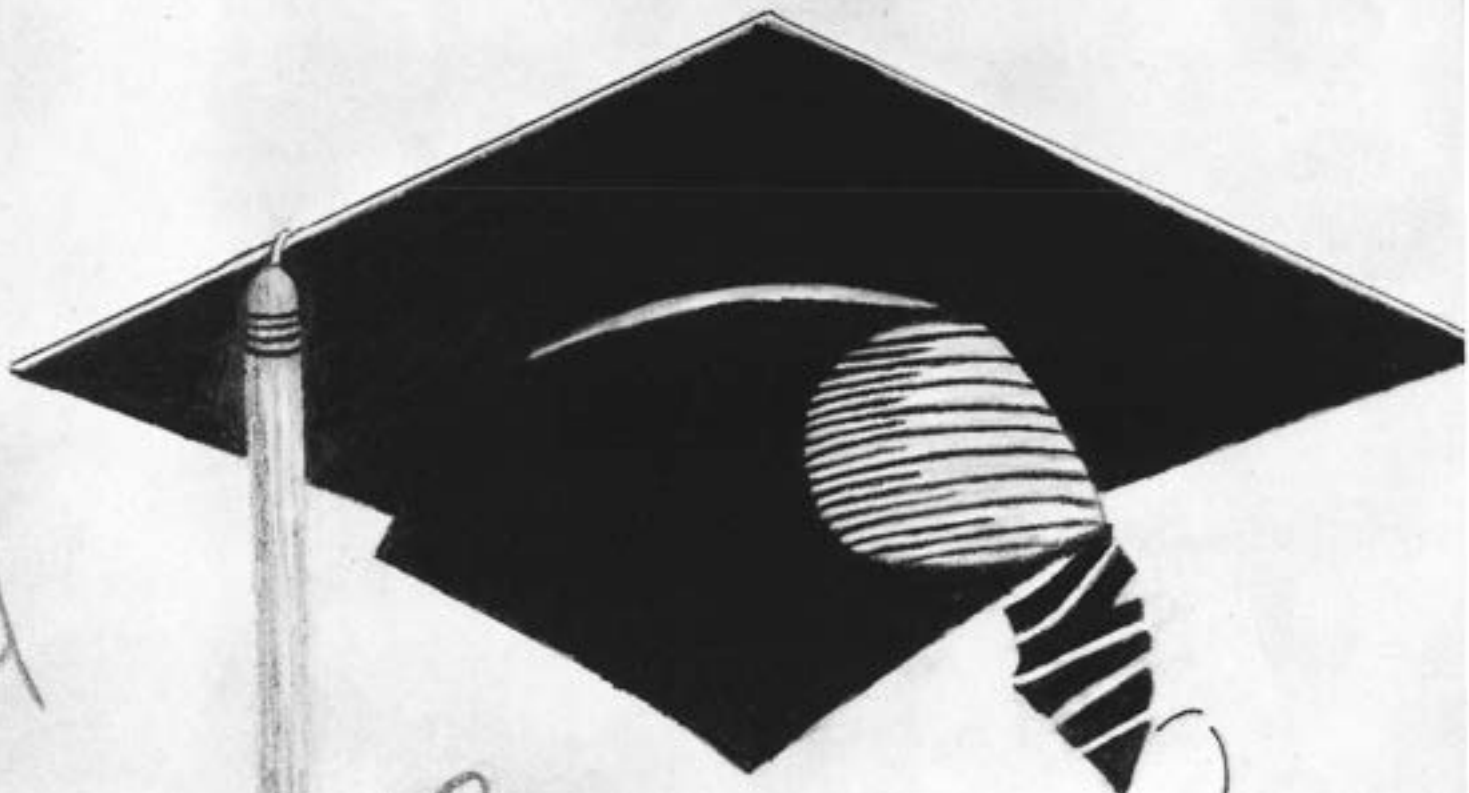
