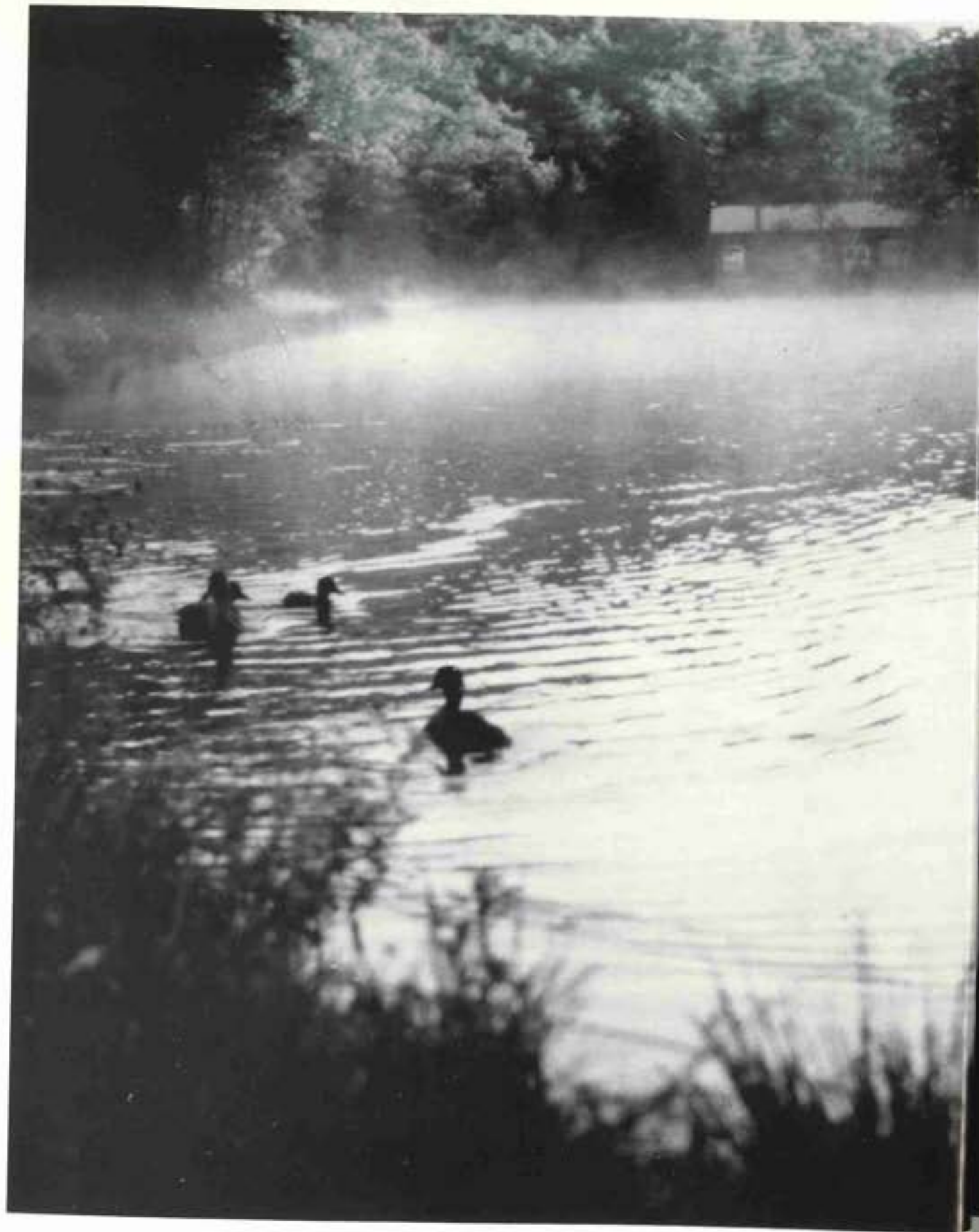

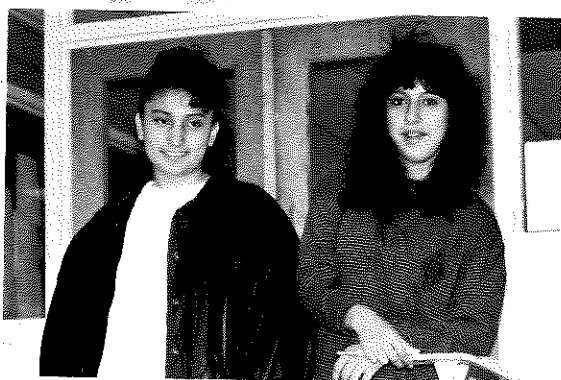
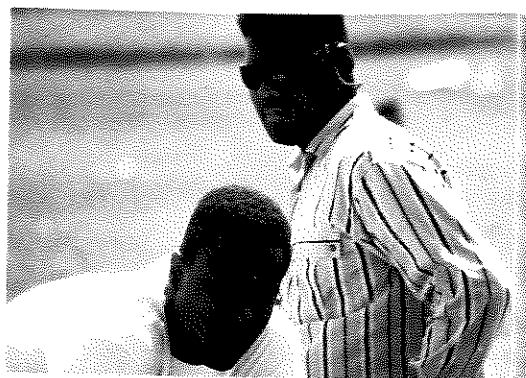
# The Road

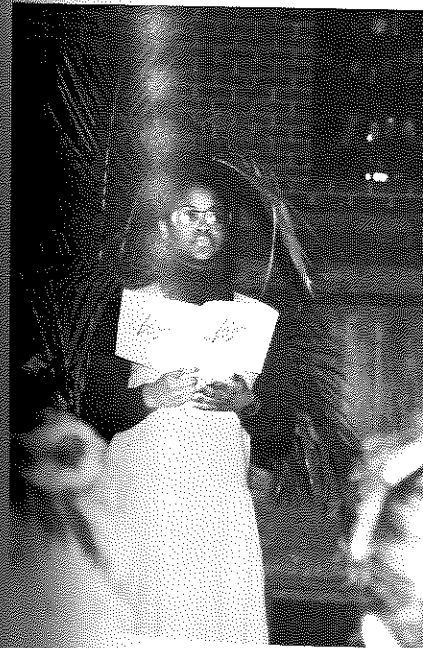
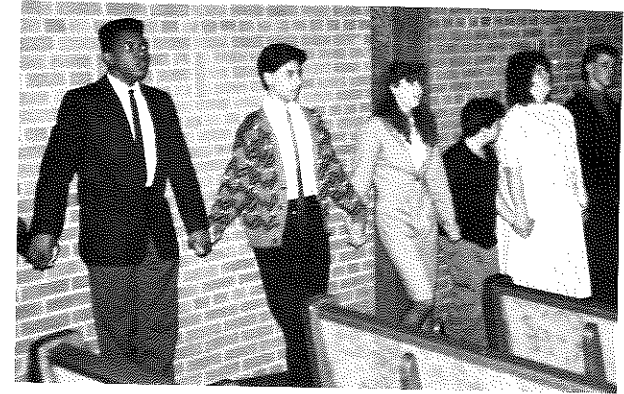
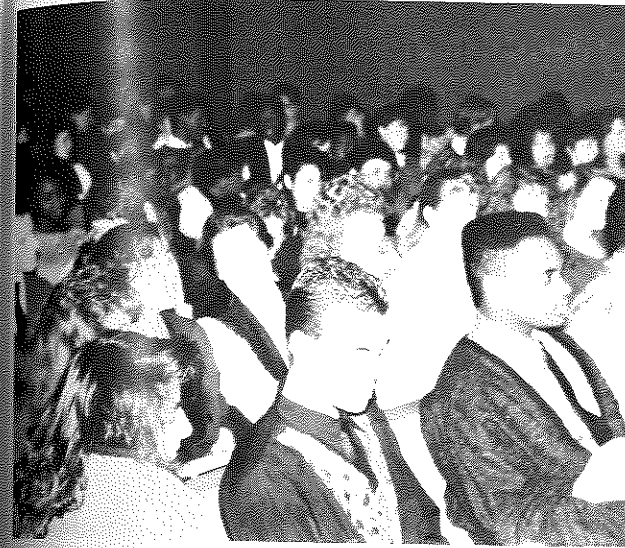
# BRANCH SABBATH SCHOOL
