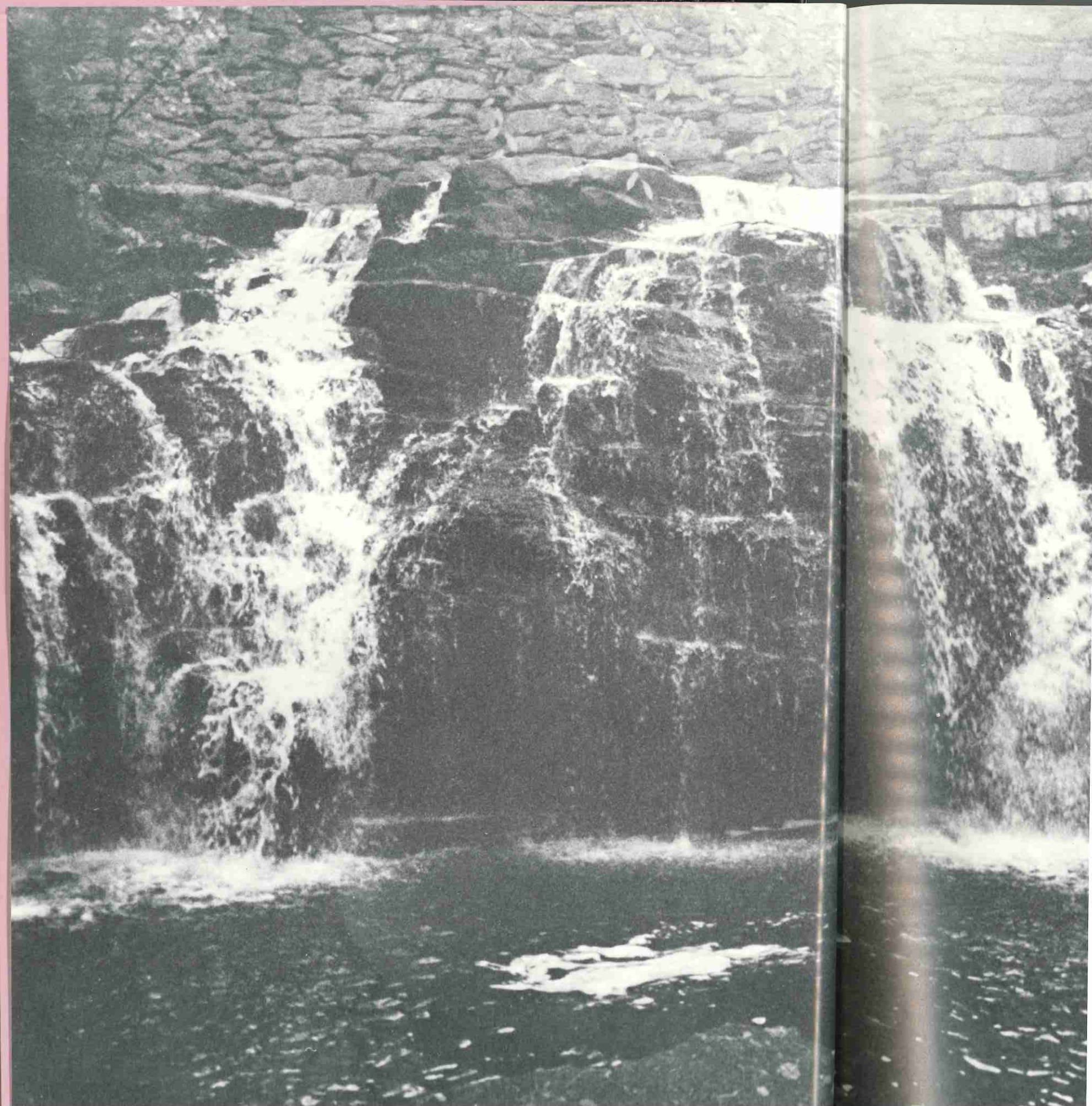

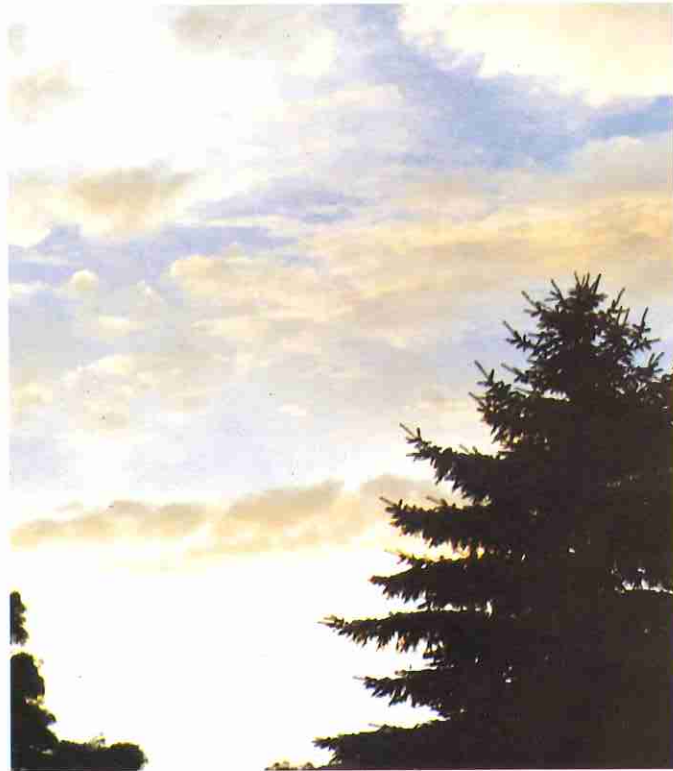

The theme of the 1990-91 Echoes is "Soaring — Flying High Above the World!"

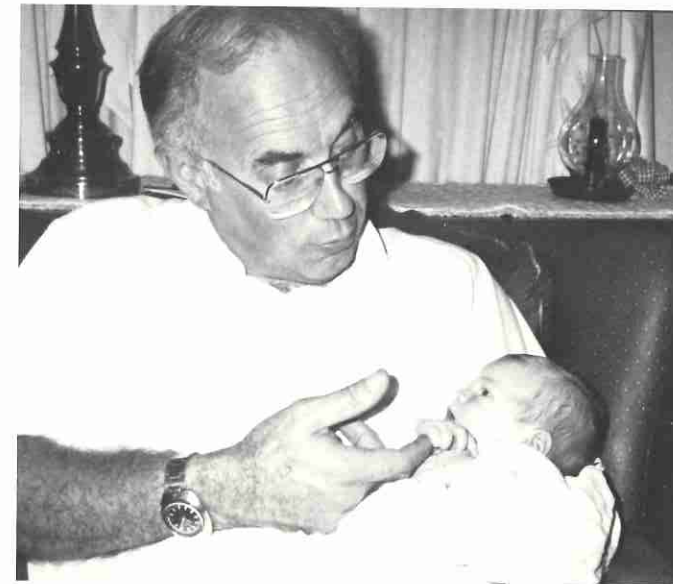

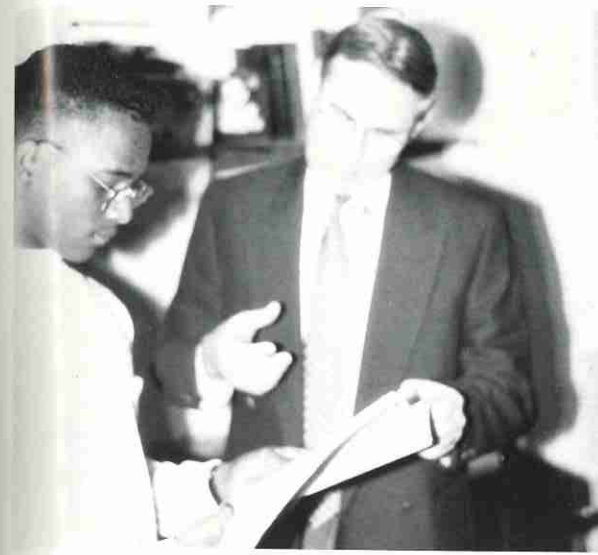
# Instruments

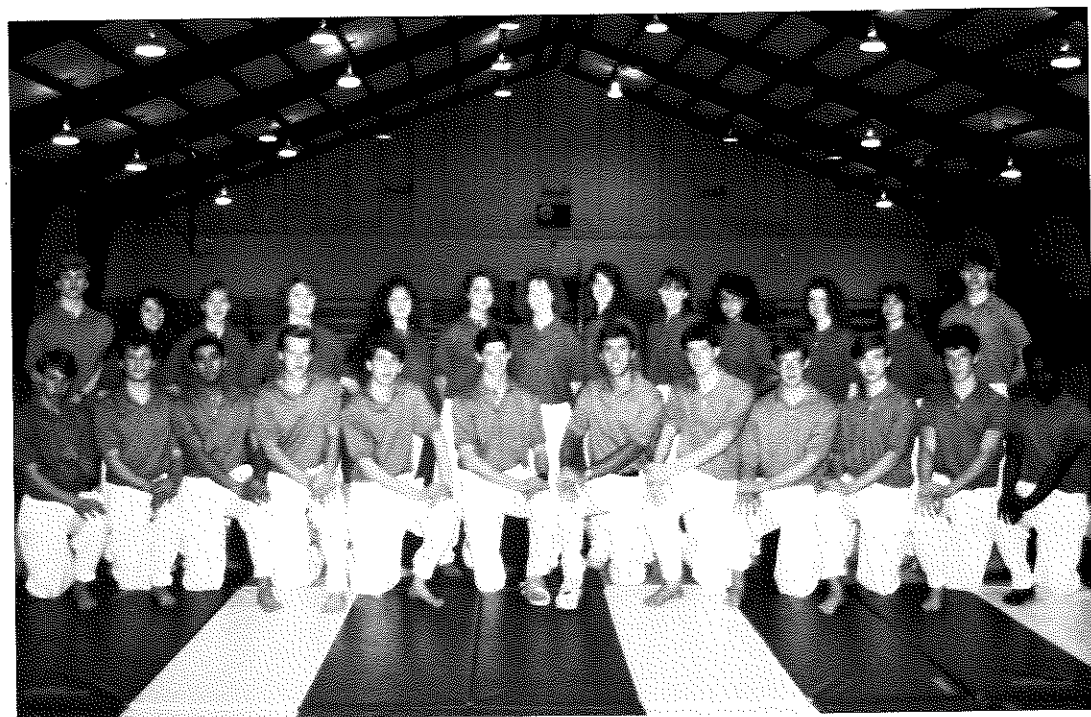
# TOURING GROUPS

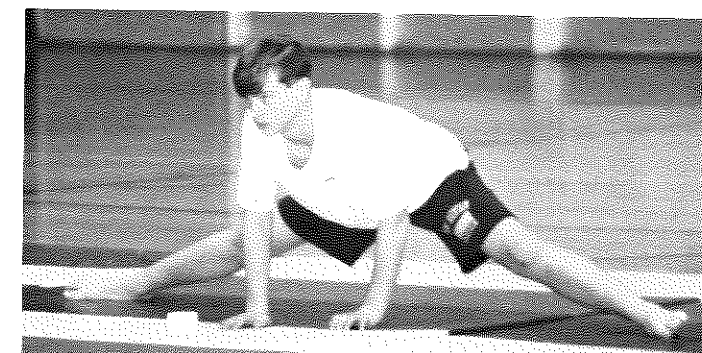

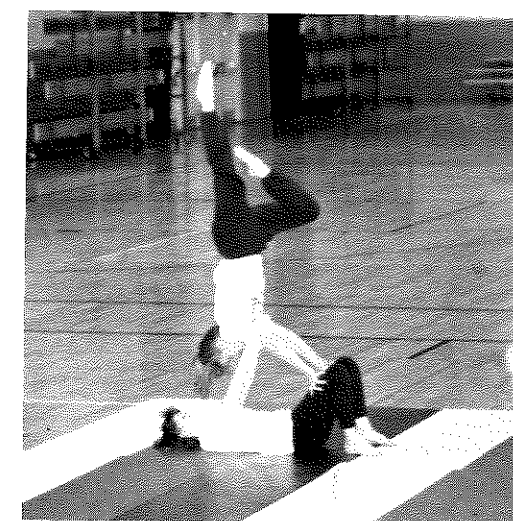
