## Principal's Message

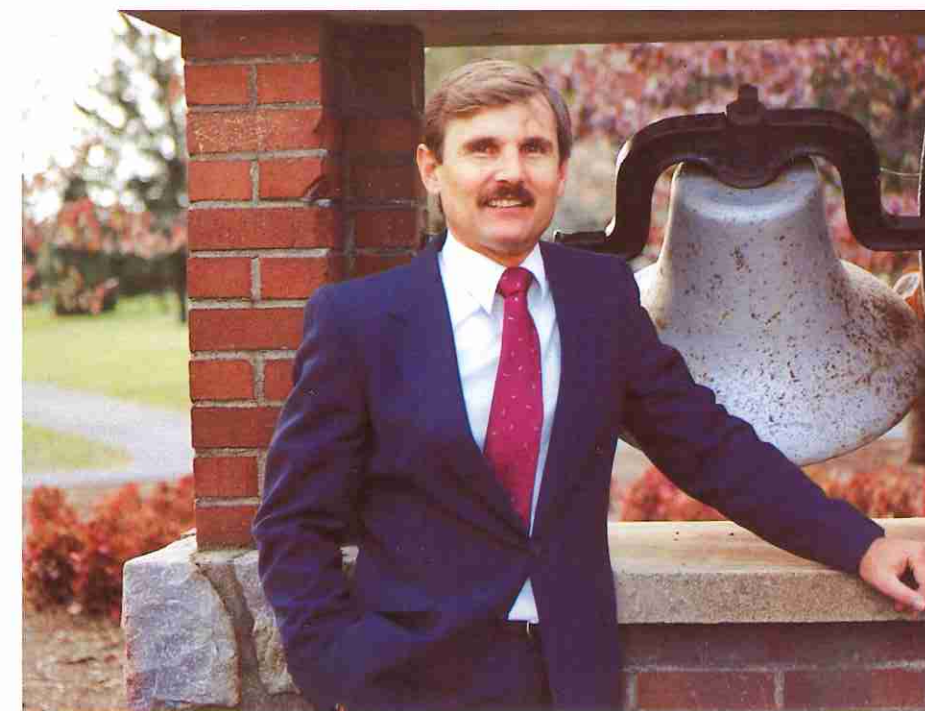

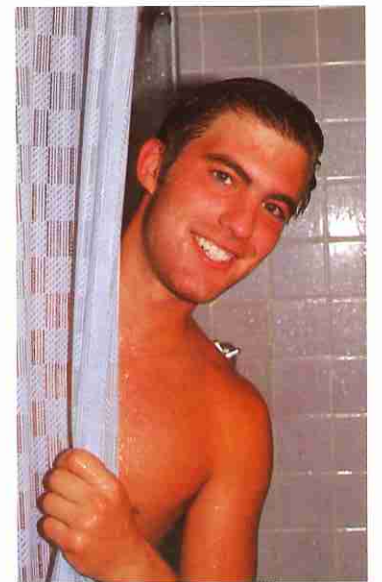
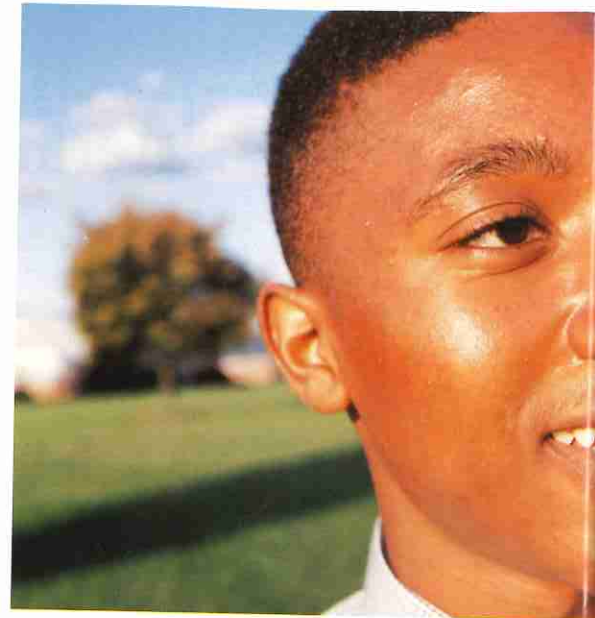


# A POINT OF VIEW

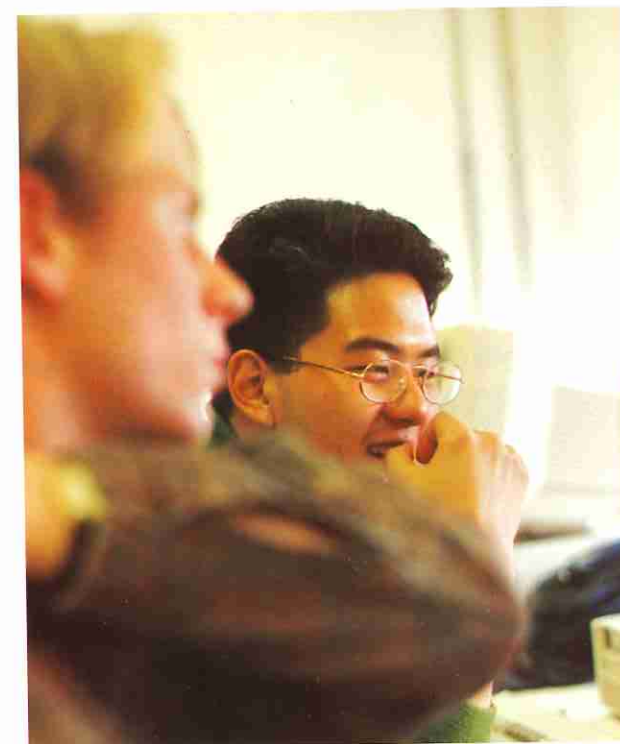

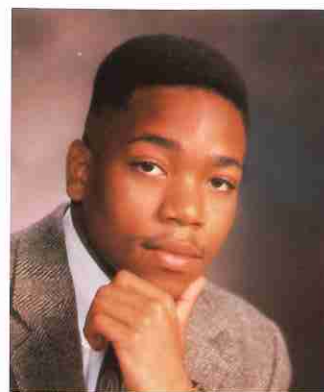
## THE CLASS OF 1993

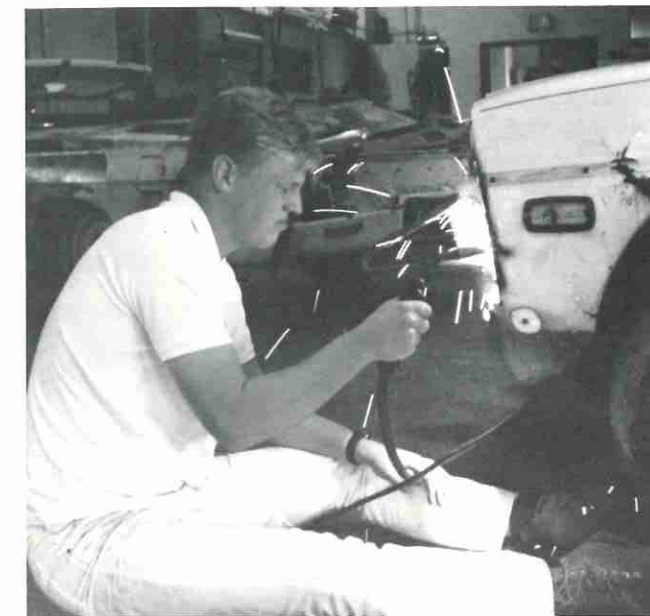




# SOPHOMORES

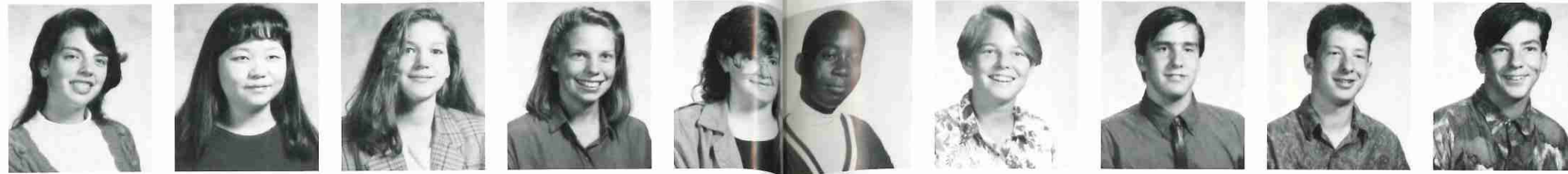
