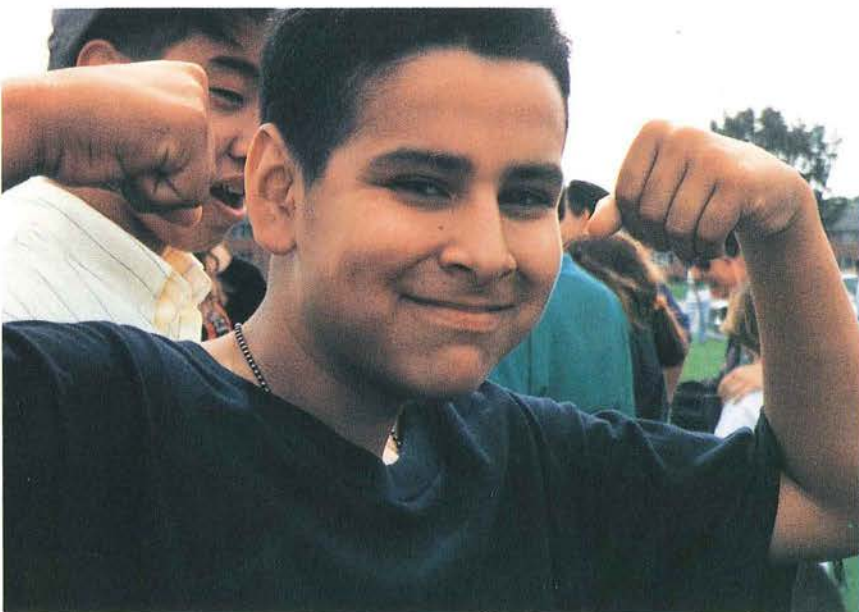

— Hebrews 3:13 (NIV)

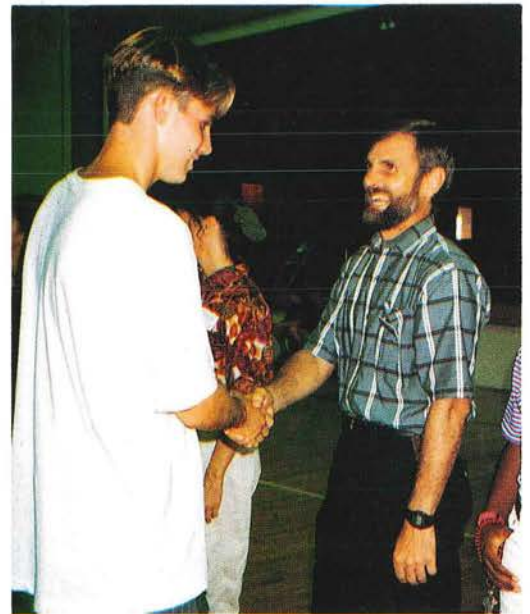

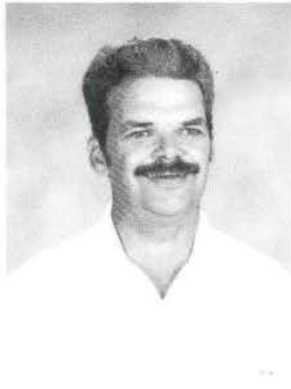

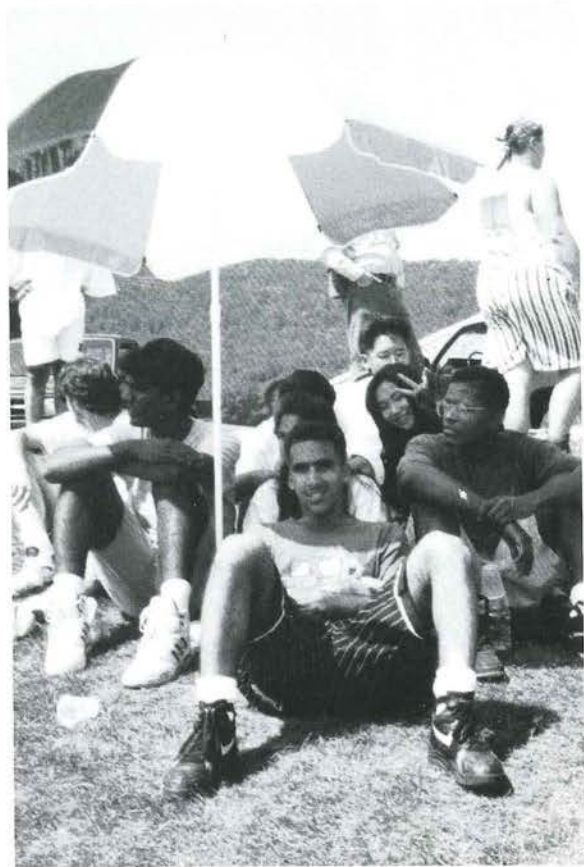
