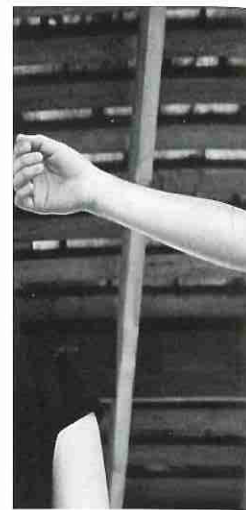

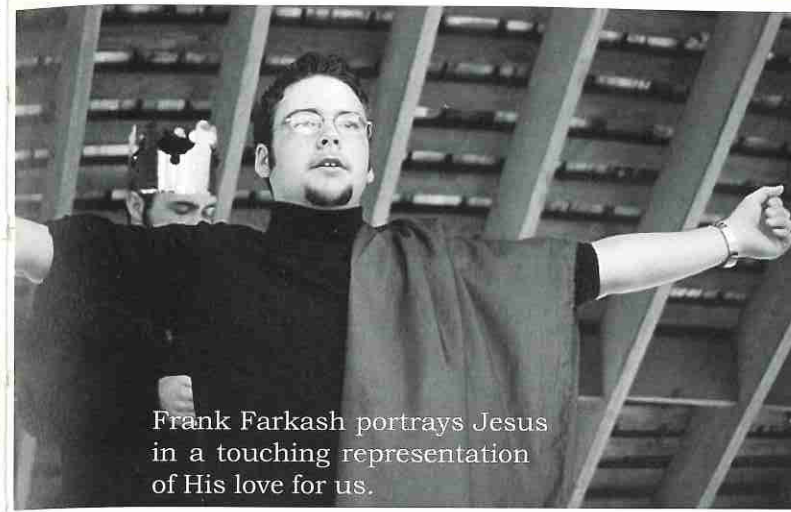

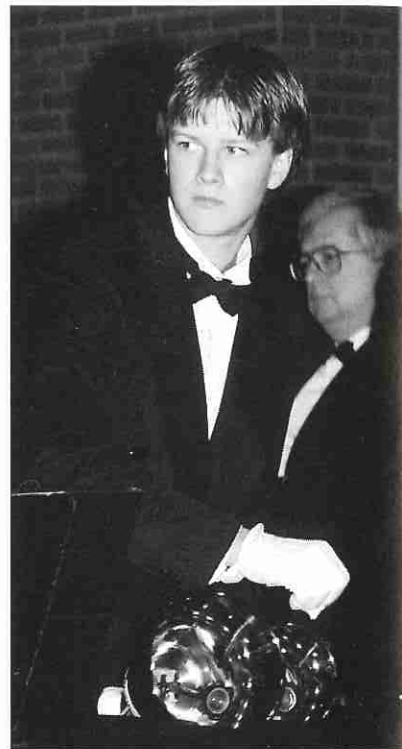

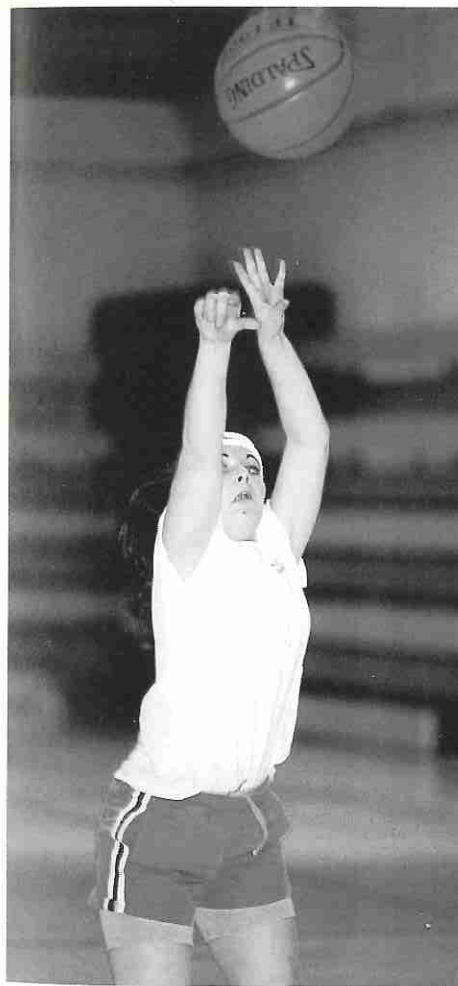

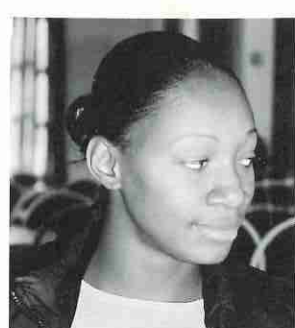

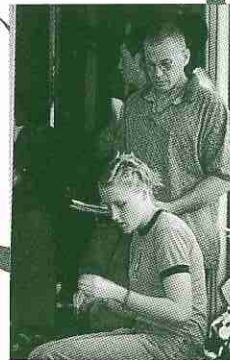


REGISTRATION Day

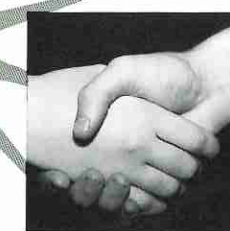

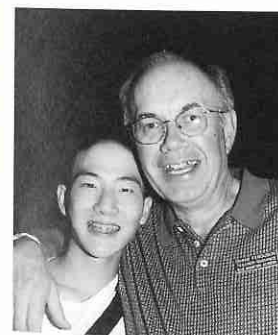

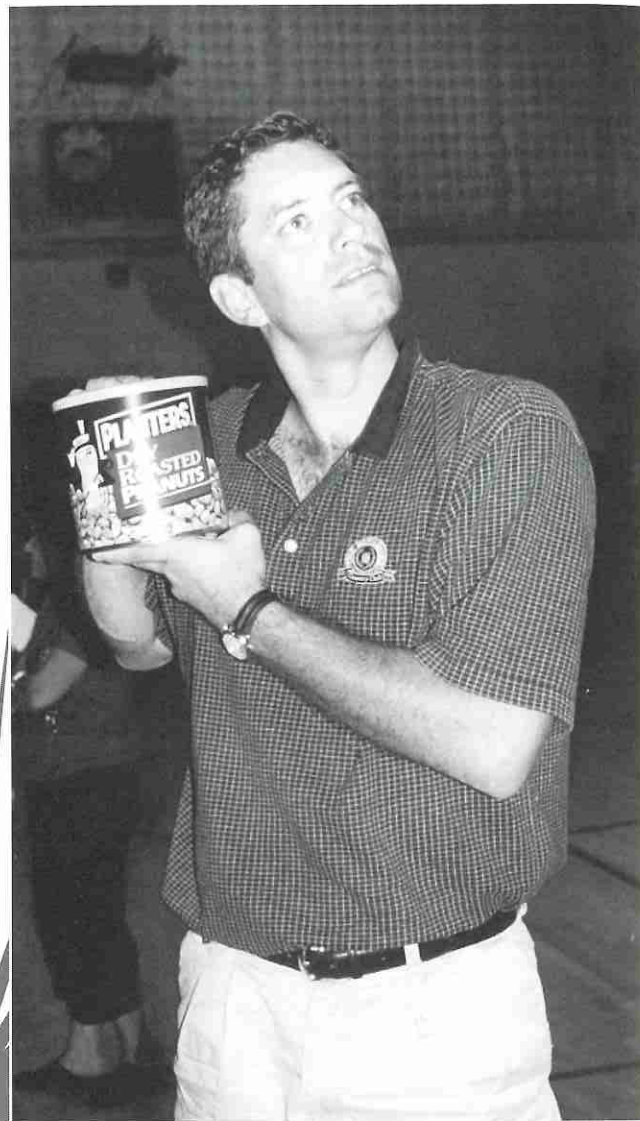

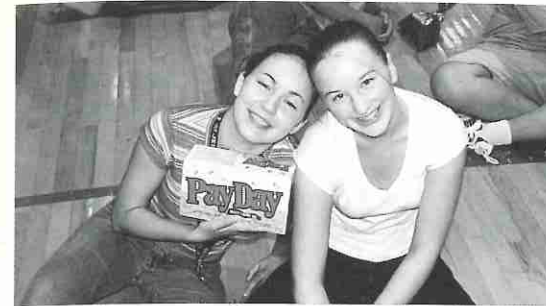
