Due to COVID-19, Blue Mountain Academy held a virtual Alumni Weekend 2021, April 23 - 25. With over 800 combined views, Burney Culpepper, Principal, announced future in-person alumni weekends will also serve its constituents virtually, accommodating those who are unable to attend in person. Leading up to the weekend, BMA sponsored "reunion meetings" (03/22 - 04/16/21) for each of the honor classes and their friends, enabling them to visit with one another via chat rooms. Each honor class was afforded the availability of two sessions of reunion meetings. Highlights of the weekend were our guest speakers, Mark Heisey (1972), Orlan Johnson (1983), and Jim Slater (1985). Having Sabbath School as a panel discussion is new this year, and was dedicated to the class of 1956, celebrating its 65<sup>th</sup> alumni anniversary. A special "then and now" video of the 1956 class was also presented. Dave Weigley (1970) moderated a hybrid Sabbath School panel discussion on the topic of "Celebrating Covenants and Community." panelists participated virtually and some were in person. A special "banner march" was provided by the 2021 graduating class, recognizing the creativity of each class and their class mottos. ## **Alumni Spotlight**

Harry Benson, class of 2013, is this issue's focus on alumni.

What was your experience at BMA? If I were to pinpoint one event that really defined my experience at BMA, it would be a project I had to do my freshman year in Bible class. The project has stuck with me ever since I was assigned it. There were two parts of this assignment, one was to sing a hymn, by yourself, and in front of the whole class. The other was to write and preach a sermon in front of the whole class. I remember the fear of singing and preaching in front of my friends, I was what you would call a shy and quiet student. But I also remember how I felt afterwards. I felt inspired. Not to sing mind you, but to preach.

Throughout my BMA experience I grew spiritually, preaching small sermons at my local home church and I was eventually baptized during my graduation weekend in 2013. I remember all the staff members, who I would eventually work with, showed love and support through hard spiritual times, not just as a student, but as a staff member as well. I remember a former staff member talked with me about how I spoke during graduation weekend, they told me, "You must do something with your talent." That love, care, and the challenge to share my faith with others is what my experience at BMA was about.

Why did you decide to come back to BMA to work? Initially, I came back to



finish paying my tuition that I owed after graduating. But after the first year I was offered a chance to stay as a full-time staff member. I do not think it was clear from the beginning what God had in store for me, but He surely was able to bring it to light as the years came and went. But I do remember a part of my agreement for working at BMA.

I made a promise to myself and to those who would come as students, that they would have an even better experience than I had. I wanted my experience to be built on and improved for those who seek a relationship with God. My full responsibility does not just involve the

day-to-day agenda items to accomplish, it requires every decision made, be made with the student's future in mind. That future involves a close walk with God. Even if they had never thought about it before coming here, I wanted to provide a place that gives as much opportunity to see the character of Jesus through their experiences with friends, special guests, and especially staff.

What is your role at the school? So, I often joke, my job is whatever needs to be done, I will do it. We all wear different hats when it comes to our jobs. But my main responsibilities include being the Industry Supervisor and the Health Food Store Manager, while also coordinating the campus recycling. I am a part of the BMA Church's chaplain team, organizing our Sabbath School program. I also have a focus on further developing BMA's media ministry as well. This entails operating our streaming and training students in how to stream or record our church services and other events and be able share the content with their loved ones and friends. Being a part of so many ministries is truly a blessing. My work here, though sometimes exhausting, is a big part of my spiritual life. I honestly think, if I did not work here, I would not be a part of the church today. God had my spiritual life in mind when He brought me to not just work here, but to accept the challenge to share my experience and my faith with our students and staff members.

Last Spring and Summer, during a time when the academy was closed due to COVID, Mr. Harry Benson hosted virtual Sabbath School services for the students, staff and anyone who wanted to view / participate. Mr. Benson did this in collaboration with student, Ever De Araujo. Ever hosted from Brazil, and often Mr. Benson and Ever would invite other guest speakers to participate.
